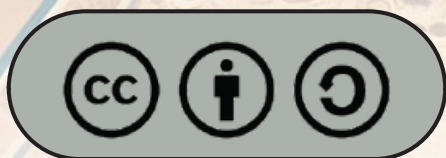


ABOUT THIS BOOK:

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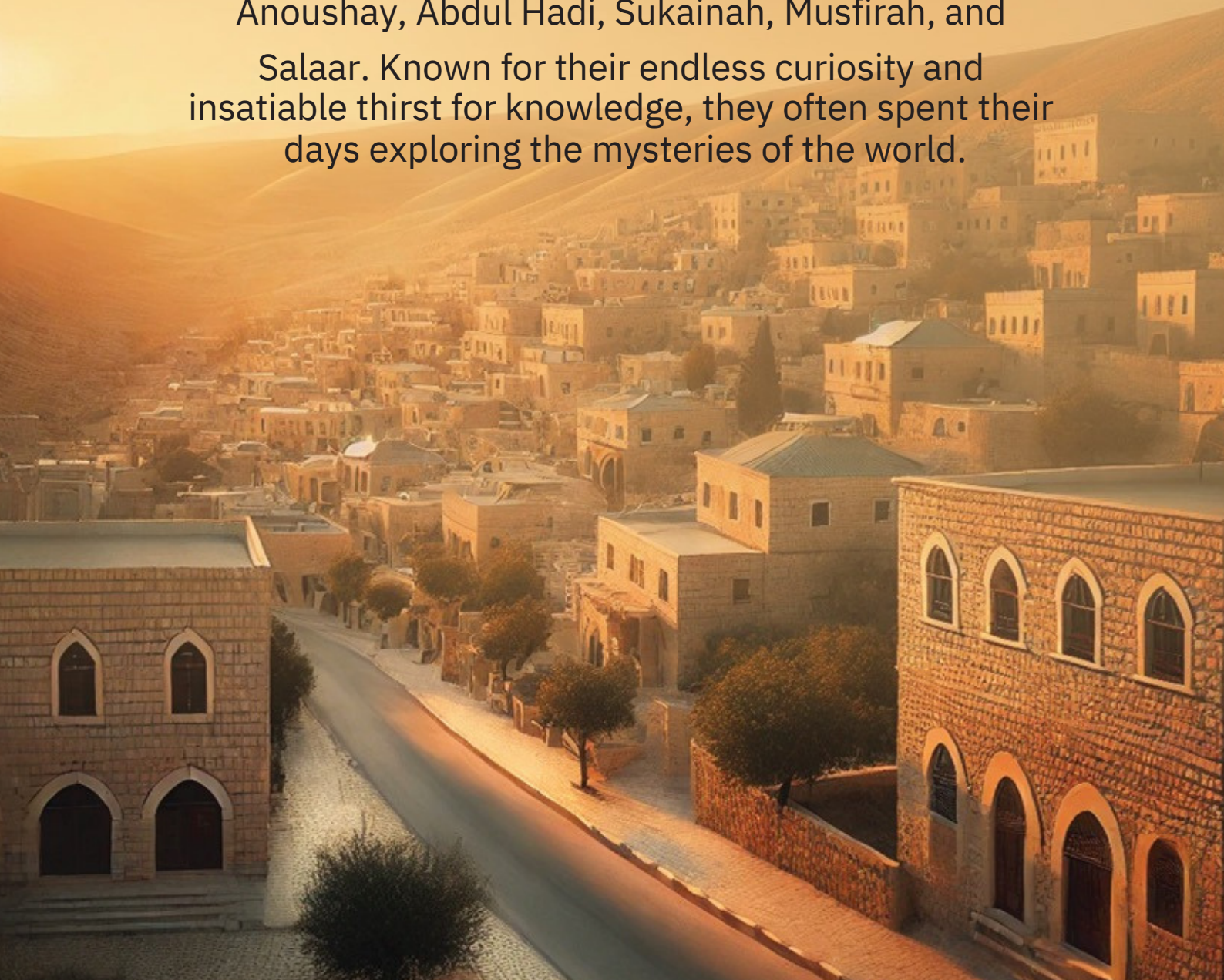
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CHAPTER 1:

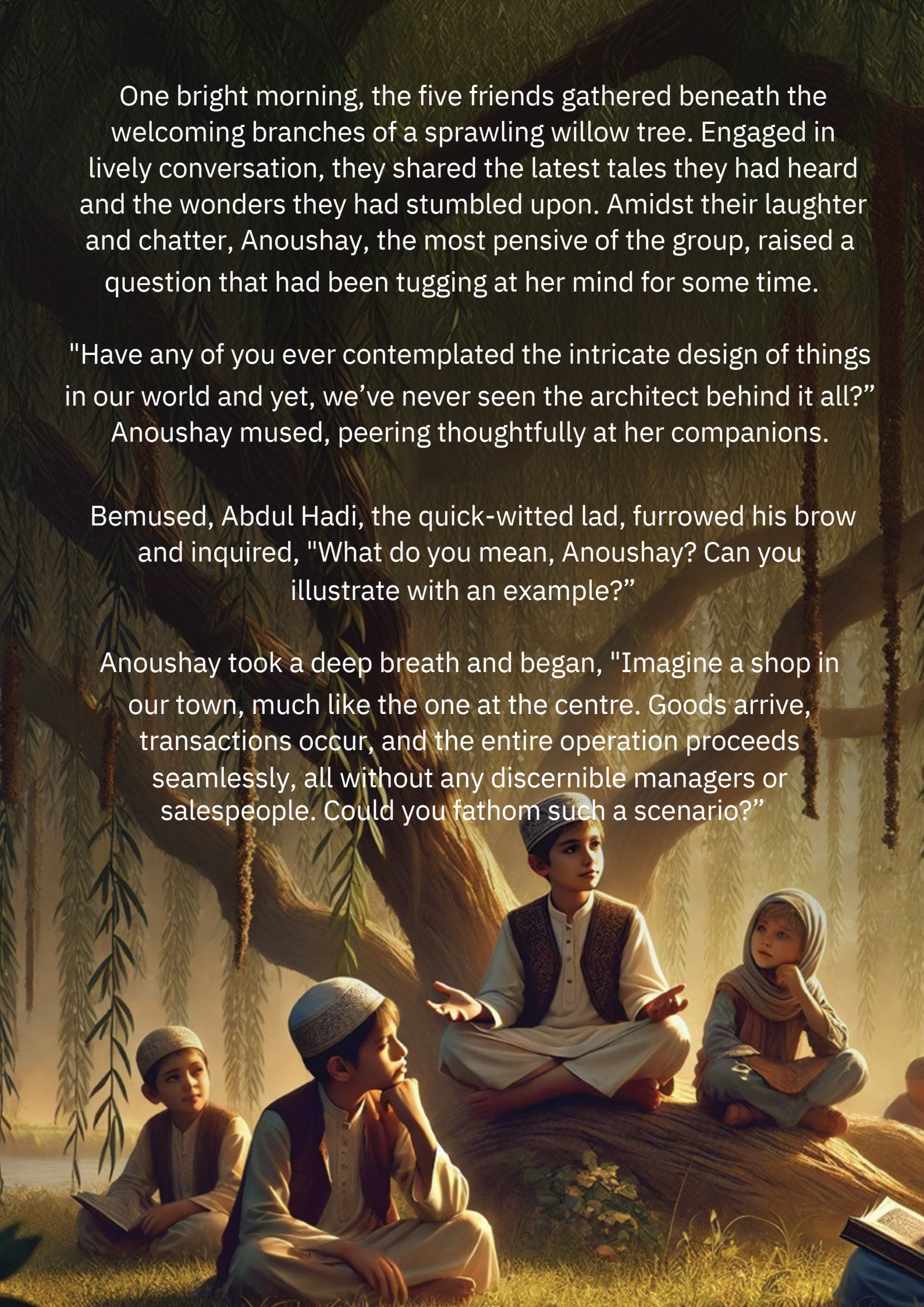

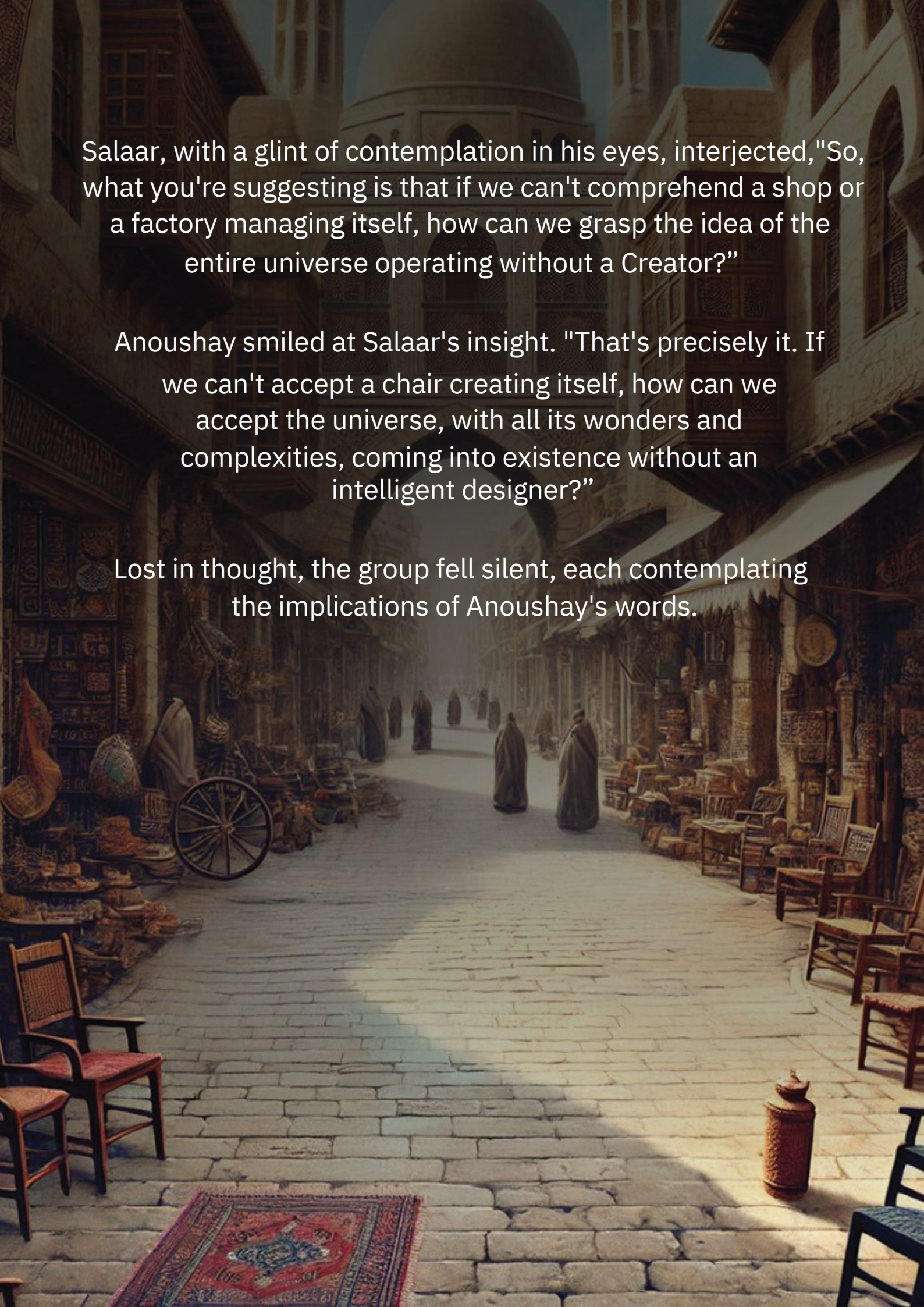


Sukainah's eyes widened in disbelief. "That's preposterous! How could that even be possible without someone overseeing it all?"

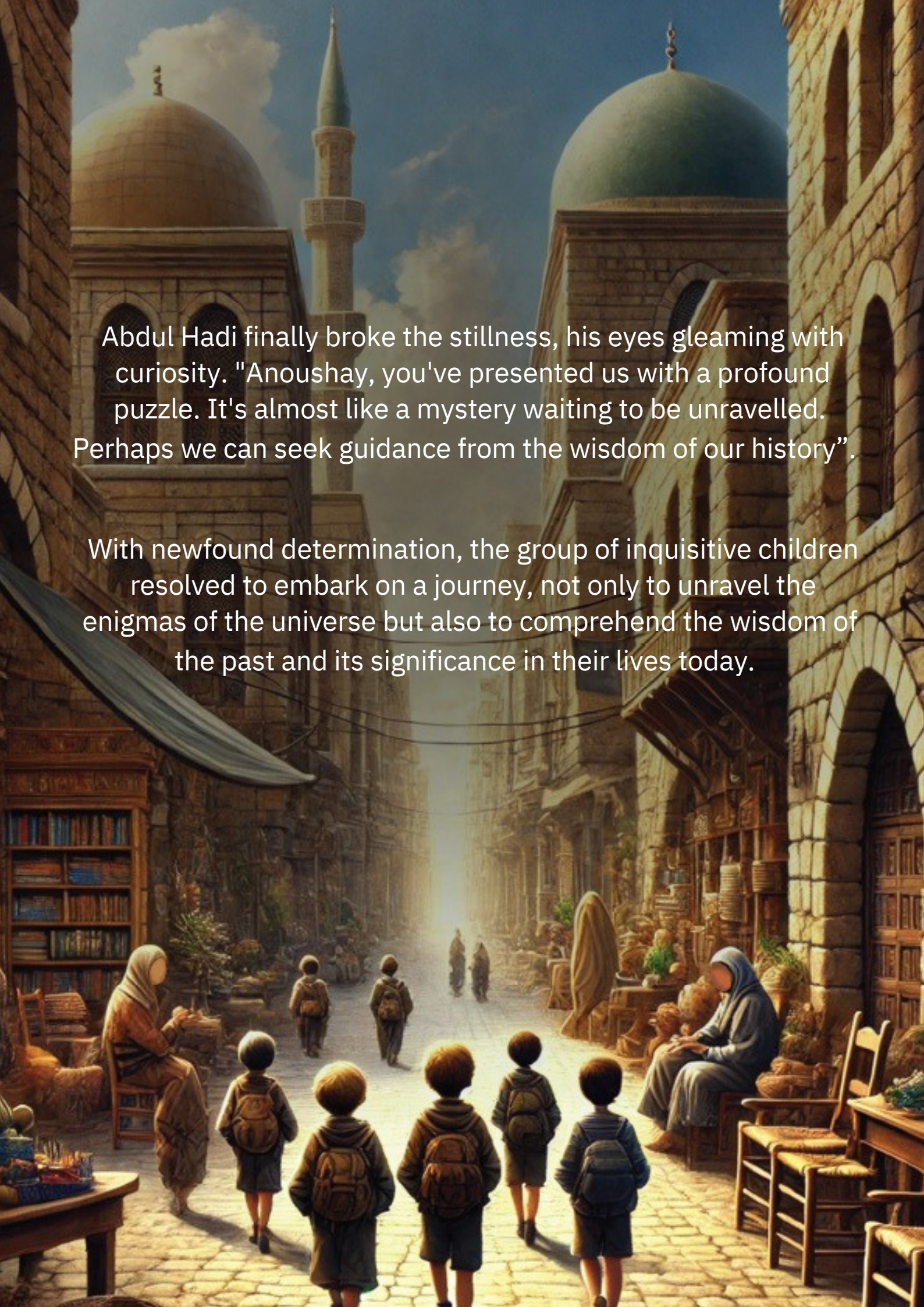

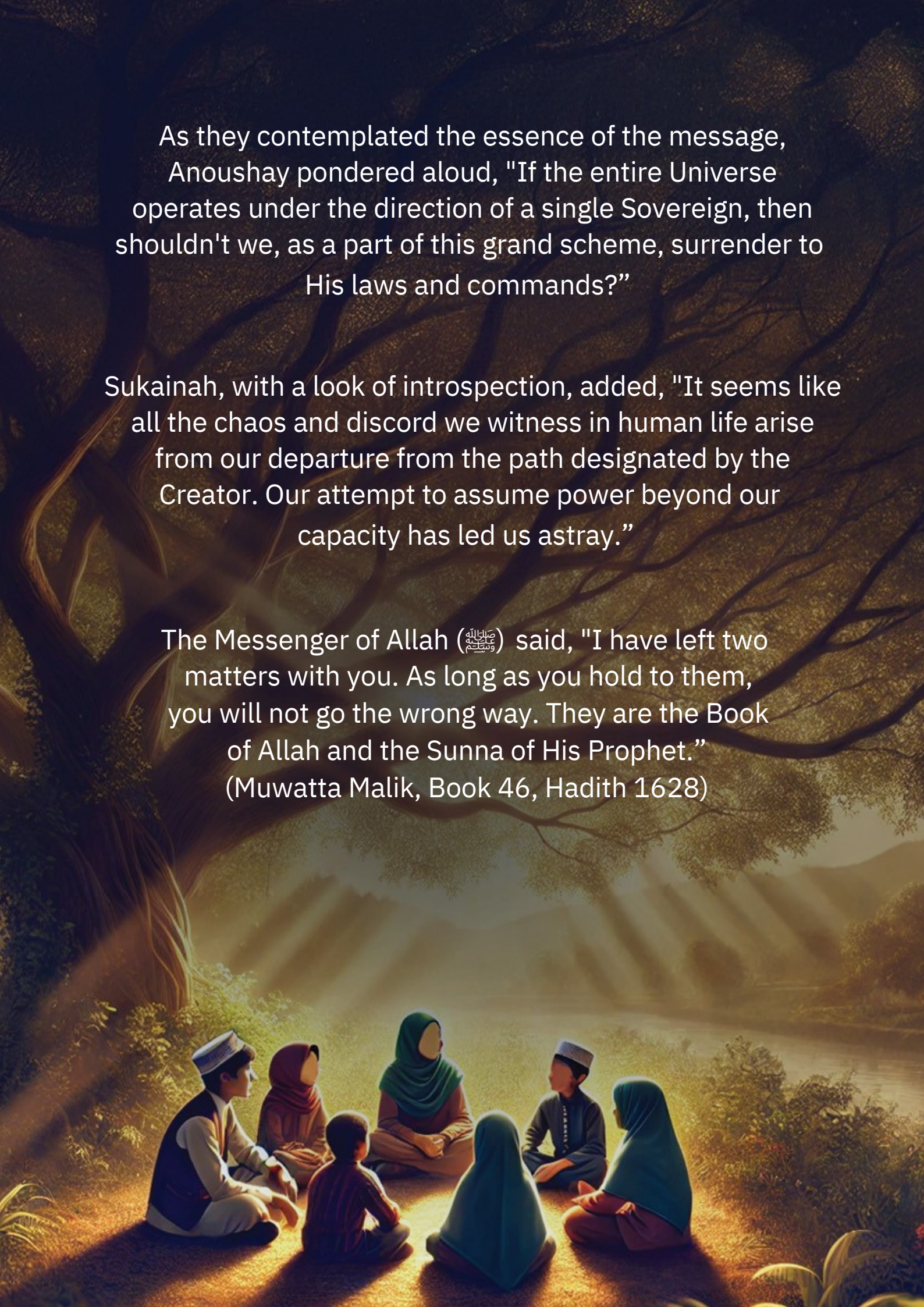




CHAPTER 3:

capacity has led us astray."

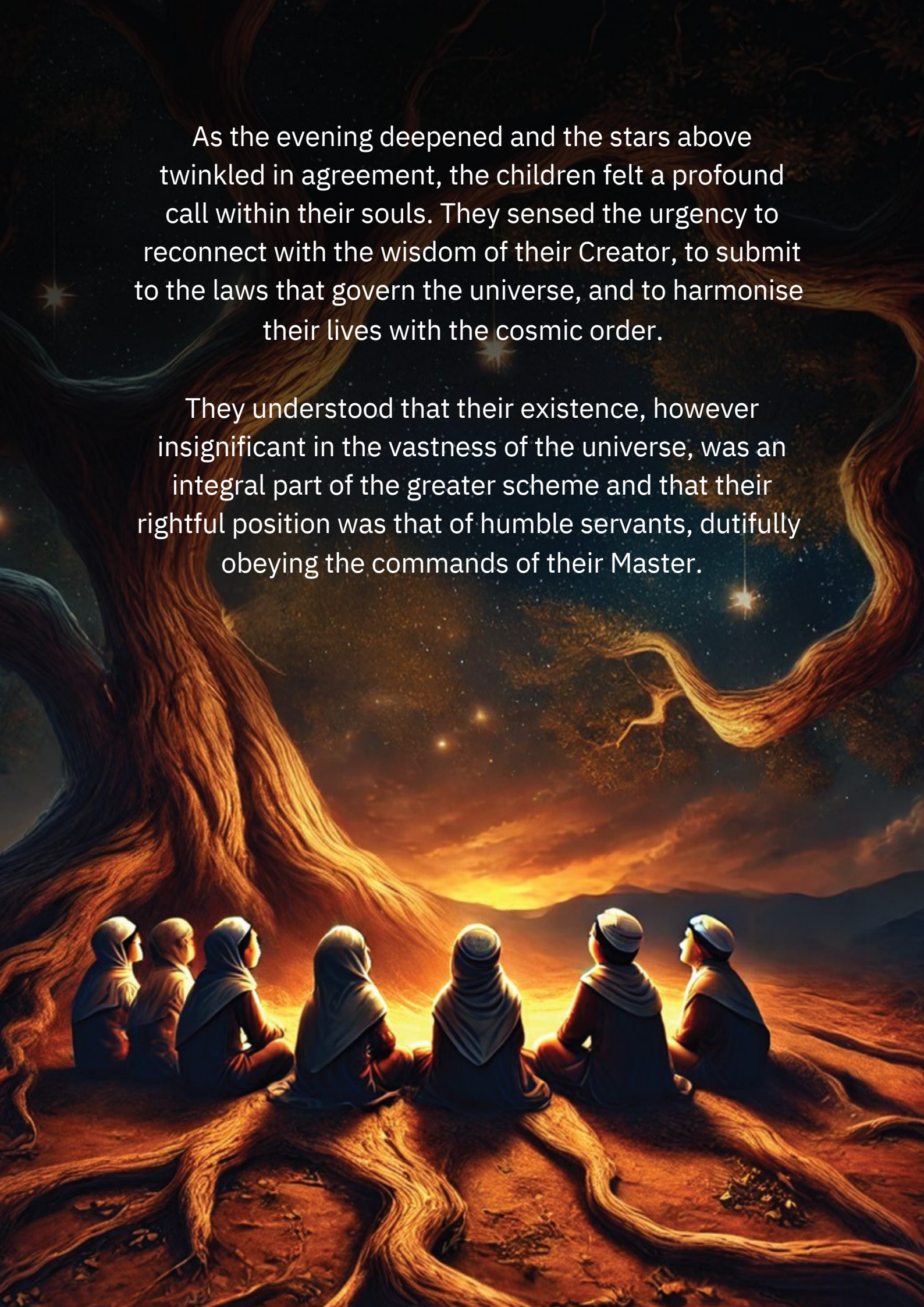
The Messenger of Allah (ﷺ) said, "I have left two

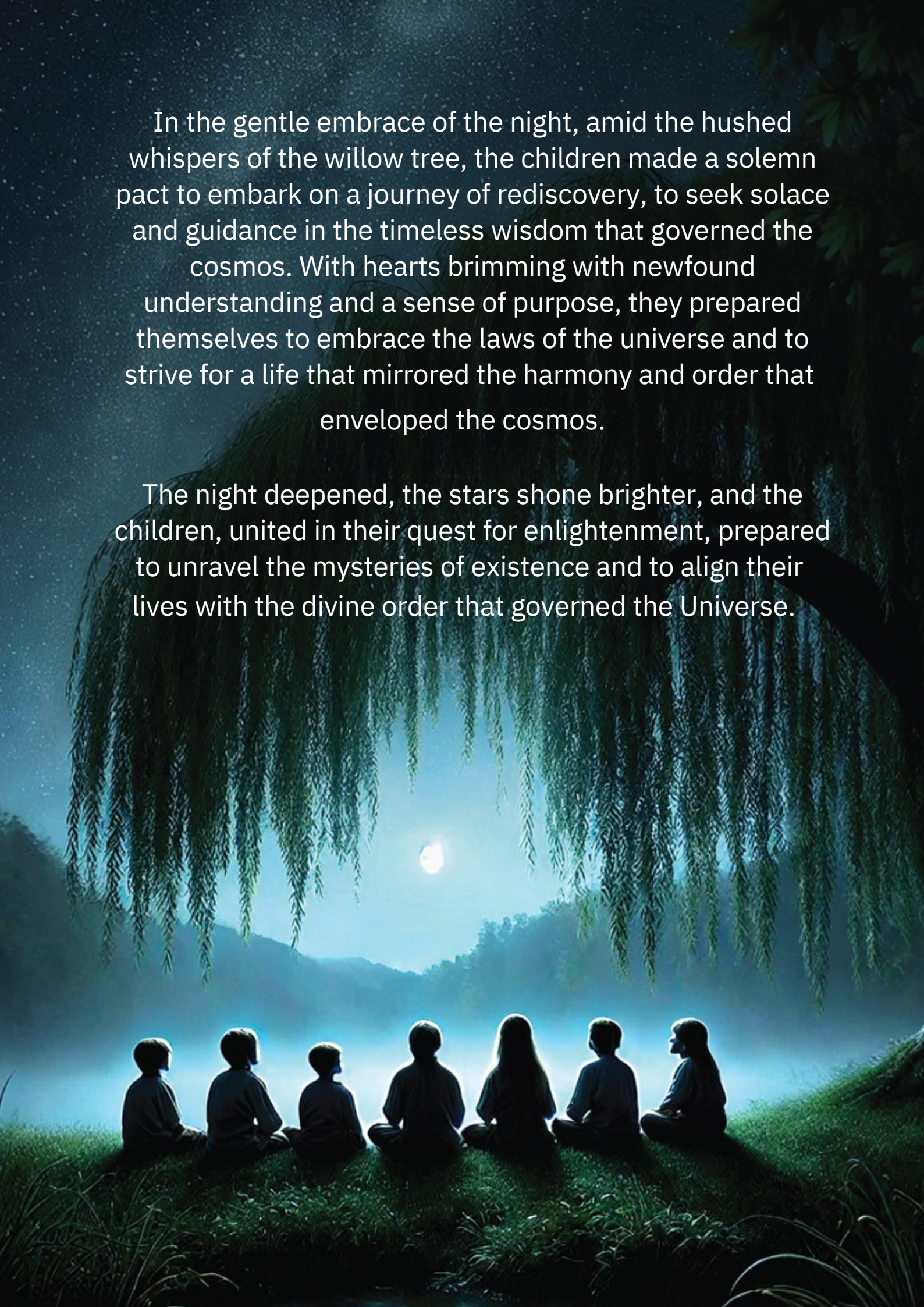

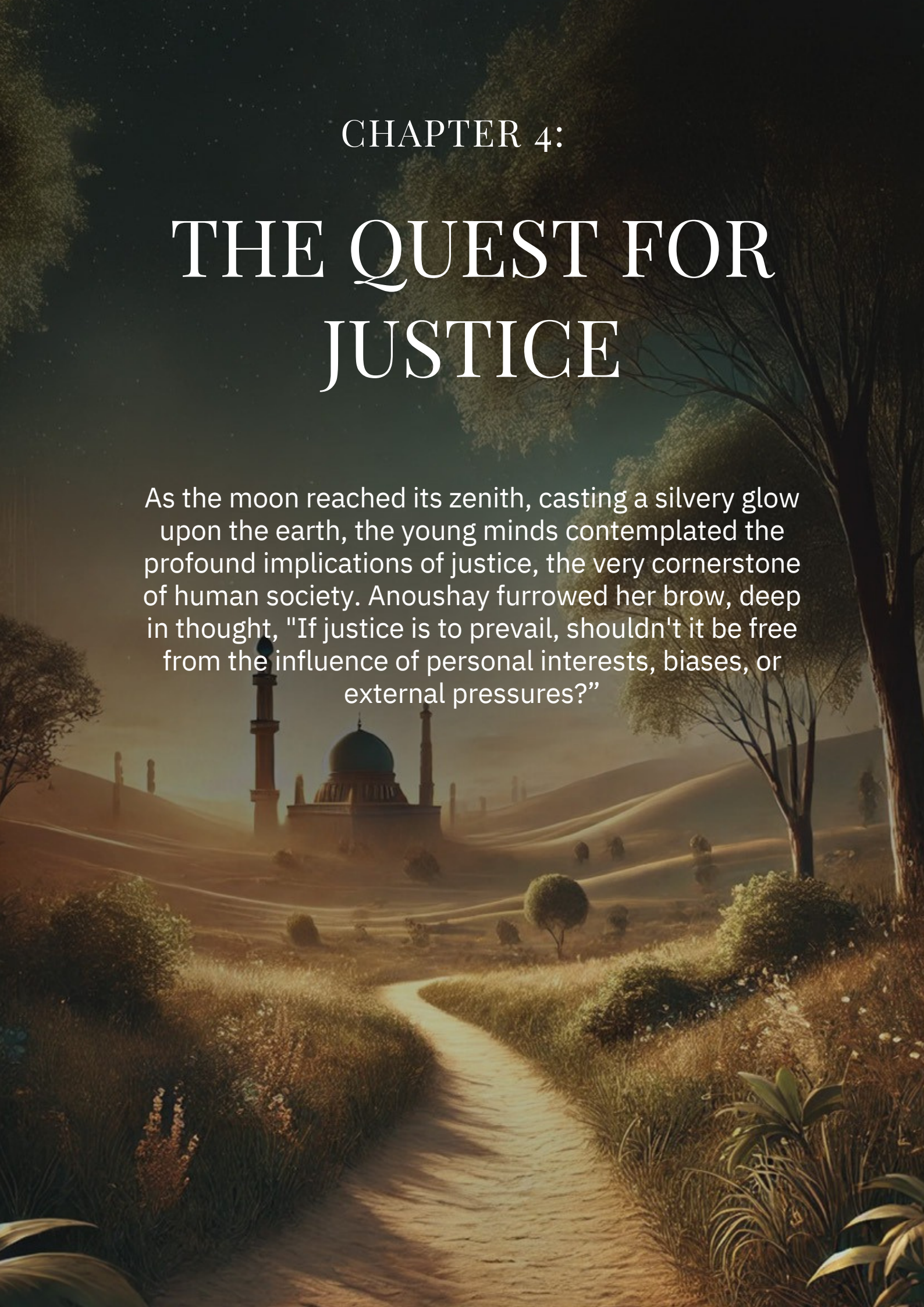

THE QUEST FOR JUSTICE

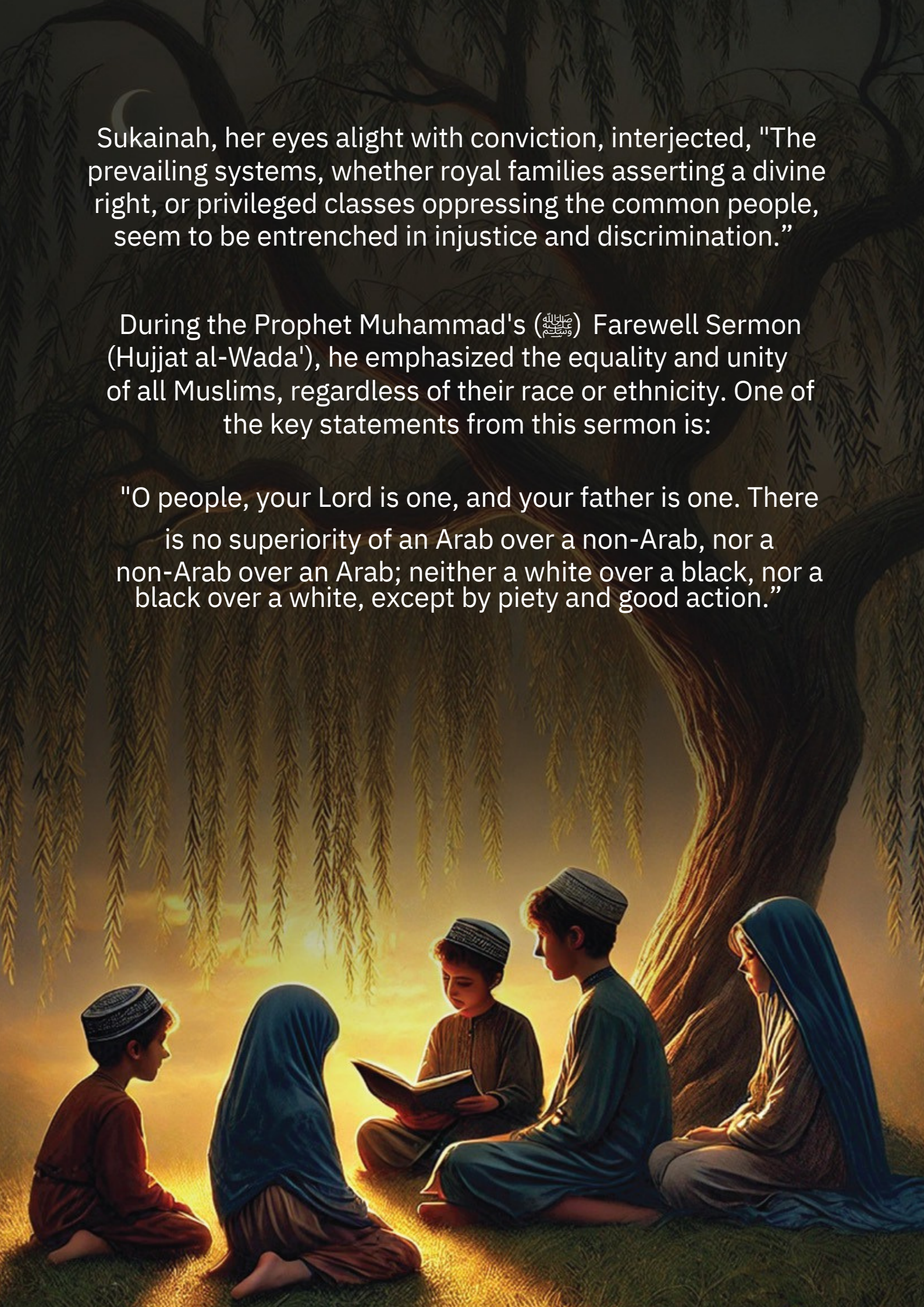
