


THE CURIOUS MINDS

Salaar. Known for their endless curiosity and insatiable thirst for knowledge, they often spent their days exploring the mysteries of the world.







Sukainah's eyes widened in disbelief. "That's preposterous! How could that even be possible without someone overseeing it all?"

(Muwatta Malik, Book 46, Hadith 1628)






CHAPTER 5:
